#### a. PUBLIC HEARING:

Mayor Joel Lopez opened the public hearings at: 7:08 p.m. (Line items 1.-5.)



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1. Consider public testimony regarding the City of Giddings Community Housing and Community Development needs as a part of the TDA TxCDBG Program.

Finance Director Heather Garner presented this to the Mayor and City Council. The TDA is requiring that this public hearing be held to discuss the housing and community development needs for those of us applying for 2025 TxCDBG funds. This is the \$750,000 grant we are applying for. A script is provided to ensure all TDA requirements are met.

Mayor Joel Lopez read the script for Community Housing and Community Development needs as a part of the TDA TxCDBG Program.

Public Hearing Script – Giddings 2025 TxCDBG Application.

Thank you for joining us for this public hearing to discuss our community's housing and community development needs.

Before we discuss our own community needs, let me provide some background on the funding opportunities through the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program (TxCDBG). The Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) administers this federal block grant funding allocated from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to the State of Texas. TDA offers competitive grant programs to distribute the funding to small and rural communities across the state. Our community has received TxCDBG funding in the past for the following projects.

- Lift Station Projects
- Economic Development (SEFCO)
- Downtown Parking and Bathroom Facility Improvements

The community needs identified in this hearing will be used to guide our own application(s) for TxCDBG funding, and to provide valuable information to TDA for the future of the program.

The first topic is affordable housing. In our community, The City of Giddings's Public Housing is administered by the Bastrop Housing Authority. The City of Giddings features sixty-three (63) income-based apartments. Homes in the area qualify for USDA home buyer incentives. There is an overall shortage of rent-subsidized rental units and affordable housing for elderly and disabled residents. Are there any comments about affordable housing?

The next topic is social services. In our community, the following social services are available to our residents: There are a variety of social services that are available to our residents. Programs sponsored by state agencies and non-profit organizations offer assistance to reduce food insecurity, weatherization assistance, assistance with utility bill payment, rental and housing reconstruction assistance, dental and medical care for uninsured residents, mental and behavioral health access, and a variety of support services for those affected by disaster events. Though several agencies exist to



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support vulnerable populations such as female led households, elderly residents, and those with disabilities, all vulnerable populations in the area are underserved due to the financial, physical, and mental stress caused by the COVID19 pandemic exhausting resources of many organizations. Are there any comments about these services, additional services that are needed, or populations that remain underserved by social services?

The third topic is public infrastructure. In our community, the City of Giddings has aging public infrastructure. We have addressed these needs in the past by seeking out grant funding when available, including the grants listed above that were obtained to address these needs. The city will continue to seek out grant funding opportunities when available. Are there any comments about our local infrastructure needs?

Finally, the fourth topic is economic development. In our community, the Giddings Economic Development Corporation works with the city administration on economic development initiatives has created a strategic plan that provides goals and recommendations developed to support and strengthen the economic vitality and resiliency of downtown Giddings. Are there any comments about economic development needs or opportunities?

Now that we have outlined many of the needs that we have in our community, let's discuss the specific funding opportunity available. In 2025, TDA is accepting applications for the Community Development Fund and the city submitted an application, committing local matching funds in order to improve our application's score. The city has been invited to continue and submit project details for an application of \$750,000 in grant funding as well as local matching funds committed in order to improve our application's score. The projects in the application must benefit primarily low- to moderate income areas.

We do not anticipate that any project we identify will result in displacement of residents or businesses; however, if this does occur, we will minimize the impact of such displacement and assist displaced persons as required by the program. I have a copy of the Application Guide that includes a list of eligible activities for this funding competition, which I can share with you as well.

### Community Needs List

1. Aged emergency rescue/response vehicles are in need of replacement
2. Water lines throughout the city are in need of replacement
3. Sewer lines throughout the city are in need of replacement
4. Drainage improvements are needed throughout the city
5. Sidewalks are deteriorated and in need of improvements
6. Sidewalks improvements for ADA compliance needed
7. Streets improvements throughout the city are needed
8. Street lighting improvements throughout the city is needed
9. Derelict structures throughout the city need to be removed
10. Traffic speed controls are needed in certain areas of the city

9. The golf course irrigation project is at least 60% complete.



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
